

\* There were two Sapphos, whether one of them was a courtesan, it  
seems clear that the celebrated poetess was not, but a person of respect-  
able character, employed at Lesbos in the education of the youth of her  
own sex, which the modest sentiments of much of her productions  
would seem to indicate, although in her youth she had become  
the victim of an unrequited love attachment to which in her odes  
are frequent allusions. The circumstance which probably gave rise to  
the fable of her having cast herself from the Leucadian cliff in a fit of  
love sick madness. — The poet Alcaeus of Lesbos was in love with  
Sappho, and praised her moral worth as well as beauty. Sappho the courtesan  
was a different person of course, also of Mytilene. The two of the same confounded  
by the Athenians, Sappho had nothing to do with the Leucadian leap. It was a rite estab-  
lished in honor of Apollo to select that death for convicted criminals on Apollos festival.  
Its connection with amatory frenzy is a mere poetic fancy, and as the fringe was into the sea  
there was a possibility at least of its not proving fatal. —
